# What is Dialogic Reading?



**Dialogic Reading** is a technique in which adults read stories to children in an interactive manner that allows for back and forth conversation.



#### **Dialogic Reading is:**

- Interactive
- Child-centered
- Done with narrative and expository books
- An activity requiring pre-planning
- Based on discussion
- For students of all levels

### **Dialogic Reading is NOT:**

- Teacher reads and child listens
- Teacher-led
- Limited to only narrative books
- Only for young children

#### Types of Questions to Ask While Reading:

- Basic "wh" questions
- Open-ended questions
- Advanced questions related to the story or questions to connect the story with the child's experiences

# Types of Questions to Ask During Book Reading:



#### **Completion question**

• "I'll huff and I'll puff and I"ll\_\_\_\_\_"

#### **Recall question**

• Which houses did the wolf blow down?

#### **Open-ended question**

• Which houses did the wolf blow down?

#### Wh-question

• Where do pig live?

### **Distancing questions**

• How do you think the pigs felt when they saw the wolf?

Strategies for Promoting Back-and-Forth Communication While Reading:

Prompt the child to say something about the bookWhat is this house made out of?

#### Evaluate child's response

• Yes, you are right, that is a wolf!

#### Expand the child's response

• Yes, that is a BIG, SCARY wolf!

#### Repeat the prompt.

• What is the house made up of?
