 - d. Heterosexual¹
 - e. Middle Class
 - f. Christian

4. To what extent are your identities different to your clients/students?

5. How do your identities and experiences impact:
 - a. The materials/stories you select for treatment
 - b. The language(s) that is more valued in your therapy session
 - c. The identities that you consider the “norm” versus “different”
 - d. The topics that make you comfortable vs. uncomfortable

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
